"All art is a form of story-telling, and mine tells the story of interpreting light — a constant element in my paintings.

Whether it is the subtle colors of dusk, or a simple stream of light in a dimly lit interior, all these effects motivate me to capture the image on canvas or paper.

Throughout the years, I have worked in watercolor, acrylics, charcoal, pen & ink, and monotypes, but my primary focus is oils and pastels. With oils, I enjoy the expressive brush



strokes and the way paint can be manipulated on canvas or paper. With pastels, I love the texture, the explosive color, and the bold strokes I can achieve."

About Desmond O'Hagan

Desmond O'Hagan is an amazing artist. He was born in Wiesbaden, Germany, but was raised in the United States, and currently resides in Denver, Colorado. He is a frequently requested workshop presenter and instructor in both pastels and in oil painting. He devotes his own art practice to both mediums and enjoys travelling throughout the world. He is internationally recognized and has won numerous awards for his work in both oil and pastel. He has Eminent Pastelist status through IAPS, Who's Who in American Art, and is a Master Pastelist with PSA in NYC.

Bold Strokes and Color. The unique characteristics about Desmond O'Hagan's work can be readily identified when you see it and you can tell that he loves explosive and diverse color as it is expressed through his use of it in combination with bold strokes throughout his work. His work includes many outdoor scenes, specifically urban landscapes. He uses both light and color in incredibly unique ways as demonstrated here:

He is spotlighted in the *Artist Network* Newsletter at the link here where he talks about painting with confidence. What I found fascinating in researching Desmond O'Hagan is his technique for using bold, expressive, direct and challenging strokes to draw the eye into the photo. It is unique and very different from other styles, with less blending (minimal blending) and watching his videos from start to finish are very interesting. The workshop should be exciting. Composed of high-quality pure pigment and a natural transparent binder. The exceptional brightness is the result of the pigment and the natural mineral fines discovered by Henri Sennelier in 1905 and that have been used in the manufacturing process ever since. The manufacturing process of the pastel does not compress the paste, and the pastel dries naturally in open air.

DESCRIPTION



This set contains an assortment of charcoal sticks including two each of Nitram Academie Fusains H (5mm, hard), HB (5mm, medium), B (5mm, soft) and Petits Batons B+ (6mm, soft round). Hard charcoal sticks create fine lines and detail, while medium charcoal sticks are ideal for drawing and sketching. Soft charcoal sticks create dark notes and shading; extra soft charcoal sticks achieve deep, rich blacks.

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION AND REGISTRATION

Desmond O'Hagan Hawaii Online Workshop March 25-26, 2023 8 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Overview

This 2-day, online workshop is designed for participants to listen to lectures, watch demonstrations, benefit from critiques, and spend ample time painting. Participants may work in pastels, oils, or both during the two days. The workshop is scheduled each day from 8:00am to 3:00pm, Mountain Time, with lunch from noon to 1:00pm.

1) Lecture topics include:

- Technique
- Style
- Choice of subject matter
- Materials for both pastels and oils
- Examining paintings in progress/step-by-step
- Critiquing your own paintings
- Framing
- Photographing for reference
- Photographing artwork

2) Demonstrations:

One demo will be completed each day; I will use both pastels and oils. Two cameras will be in place to cover both my palette and the painting. I strive to depict color accurately, but this may vary from computer to computer. Current and previous workshop demos are for sale.

3) <u>Critiques:</u>

- Individual critiques will be provided equally to each participant and in the same order each day. Your patience is appreciated.
- Sharing specific goals you have for this workshop is welcome and will allow me to focus my comments. My goal is to provide information and insight for participants to incorporate what works for them and disregard what does not work.

- Participants may hold their painting up to the camera or send me a photo. Cell phone photos are fine.
- All are welcome to listen to each critique as this is a beneficial learning tool. Please let me know if you prefer to have your work critiqued privately.

A note about technology – Glitches may occur due to different networks. The Zoom link will follow but check your technology.

SUPPLY INFORMATION FOR THE WORKSHOP

Desmond O'Hagan Workshop Suppy List

Set of soft pastels with a good variety of dark, medium, and light colors (no oil pastels or nu pastels). The brands I use are Unison, Rembrandt, Sennelier, and Jack Richeson soft pastels. If interested (but not necessary for the workshop), I have designed a pastel set for Jack Richeson Co. titled Desmond O'Hagan Essential Pastels which can be purchased at Dakota Arts and Judson Art Outfitters:

Please have pastel papers of choice (not too heavily sanded), easel, drawing board support for pastel paper, masking tape, kneaded eraser, and a variety of photographs from which to work.

If working in oils, the colors I use, if interested, are Ultramarine Blue, Cerulean Blue, Viridian, Burnt Sienna, Alizarin Crimson, Cadmium Red Light, Cadmium Orange, Cadmium Yellow Light, and Titanium White. I recommend a variety of brush sizes including some larger flats or brights (8 or 10).

Lastly, please have two medium thick point magic markers (black and medium grey) and a few sheets of regular white printer paper.

From me, on the PAH Newsletter! Claudia Haywood, Editor PAH Newsletter


Aloha everyone!
